N.B.:

- 1. Please <u>ignore</u> this email if you are a Spring 2022-23 confirmed candidate. Stay tuned for another email that will be sent in May 2023 with all the necessary commencement details.
- 2. Make sure to <u>consider</u> this email if you were a Spring 2022-23 expected candidate for graduation who for some reason ended up not completing the graduation requirements, yet still intends to march in the ceremony. The submitted online application for graduation for Spring 2022-23 in that case doesn't confirm your eligibility to participate in the commencement exercises, you must complete the mentioned online petition by the set deadline.
