AUB students organize IBDAA 2020 online highlighting SDGs on gender equality and climate change

The American University of Beirut (AUB) Nature Conservation Center (NCC) held its first-ever virtual poster forum competition, IBDAA 2020.

International Biodiversity Day at AUB (IBDAA) is an annual nation-wide poster forum and student competition. It is an unconventional approach towards education where students come up with innovative ideas focusing on biodiversity and environmentalism. And indeed, with the committee's hard work, IBDAA 2020 took place on Wednesday, April 22, 2020, on the UnHangout Platform, a virtual platform developed by MIT.

Al Nemer also commented on her personal experience with the IBDAA event and competition. "It made me discover my passion for the environment and realize that it is my responsibility, even if on a small scale, to protect the planet. And as a person who has a passion in leading and working in teams, I realized that I can join these two together and make a larger positive impact with different people all collaborating together."

The IBDAA 2020 organizing committee was formed of AUB students from different majors, who did their best to overcome all the challenges and make IBDAA 2020 happen, despite the difficult circumstances the world and the country are going through.

"Being part of the IBDAA 2020 organizing committee and a previous IBDAA participant, made me realize that everyone has the potential to develop creative ideas that can help solve environmental challenges. All we need is motivation and the opportunity to showcase our ideas." said AUB student Nathalie Chahrour. Every year, IBDAA highlights one or more of the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).
