Materials Science and Energy International Symposium

The Materials Science Initiative in the Faculty of Arts and Sciences and the Faculty of Engineering and Architecture is organizing the first AUB Symposium on Materials Science and Energy, supported and funded by the Munib and Angela Masri Institute of Energy and Natural Resources, on April 22, 2014, 9:00 am - 2:00 pm, in Samir Zaabari, Science Lecture Hall.

Professor Michael J. Aziz, School of Engineering and Applied Sciences, Harvard University

Professor Sebastian Volz, CNRS, Ecole Centrale de Paris.

In addition, a two-hour poster session will be held in the garden outside of the Science Lecture Hall, where AUB faculty and students will be presenting their latest research work in the area of materials science, with special emphasis on energy research. This symposium will present an opportunity to learn about the latest research in nanoscience, materials science and energy related applications in the different faculties at AUB. In addition, the Masri Institute for Energy and Natural Resources will be announcing during the symposium the awarded research grants for the fifth research funding cycle. Three awards for best students' posters (\$400 each) will also be announced.

• Lecture on the Experience of LCPS in Influencing Policymaking in Lebanon

The Issam Fares Institute for Public Policy and International Affairs is organizing a Director's Policy Series Lecture, "Setting the Agenda: The Experience of LCPS in Influencing Policymaking in Lebanon," by Mr. Sami Atallah, on Tuesday, April 22, 2014 from 3:30 pm to 4:30 pm, in the Issam Fares Institute (Green Oval), Auditorium - AUB.

Sami Atallah, who is trained in economics and political science, is the director of the Lebanese Center for Policy Studies (LCPS). Prior to joining LCPS, he served as a consultant for the World Bank, the European Union and the United Nations Development Program in Lebanon and Syria. Atallah also served as an advisor for the Lebanese Ministries of Finance, Industry, and Interior and Municipalities, as well as in the Prime Minister's Office. In addition, he taught economics and political economy at the American University of Beirut (AUB).

At LCPS, he is currently leading several policy studies on the governance of the gas sector, electoral behavior, monitoring the Parliament and political parties, economic diversification and industrial policy, and decentralization and service delivery. From November 2012 till April 2014, Atallah served on the Committee established by the Lebanese Prime Minister to draft a decentralization law.

He has two master's degrees in international and development economics from Yale University (1996) and in quantitative methods from Columbia University (2004). He is currently completing his PhD in politics at New York University.
