The award also fulfills our mission of encouraging people 'to become custodians of their environment.'"

Karim, Youssef, Raed and Maher Abillama wanted to honor their father, Samir, for his 80th birthday by donating toward environmental entrepreneurship, a topic dear to him. Samir Joseph Abillama is the president of Al-Amir Holding, a growing regional family enterprise active in a variety of sectors including the automotive, architecture and industrial design, real estate development and facility management sectors.

An architect by background, Samir Abillama is a born entrepreneur, who, along with his brother Nabil, turned the family business into a diversified and successful industrial and services group with a presence in the Middle East, Europe and Africa.

Creative by nature, his curiosity, culture, sense of community and responsibility inspired him to develop many interests that include art and nature.

"What distinguishes Samir is his desire to always help others around him, not only financially but by offering his personal time with dedication and passion," said Youssef Abillama, his eldest son. "He has succeeded to pass on to us his entrepreneurial drive and his sense of service to the community."
