• Seminar Series on Food Packaging

The Department of Nutrition and Food Science is organizing a seminar series on "Food Packaging," sponsored by USAID and ACDI/VOCA. Topics will include role of packaging in preserving product quality and safety, MAP, sustainability and recycling.

Lecture 1: The Role of Packaging in Maintaining Product Quality and Safety

This session will explore how packaging materials and containers are used to protect food products from elements such as moisture, oxygen and light. Differences in barrier and product compatibility will be highlighted. Active packaging technologies will be discussed and how they are currently being used to extend product shelf life. Preservation techniques such as modified atmosphere packaging, irradiation and aseptic processing and packaging will be included in the presentation.

Determining the shelf life of food products is a fundamental need to successfully commercialize products. Thus, this session will provide the fundamentals of shelf life modeling and prediction. It will also describe product-package interaction, and the basic to measure barrier to membranes.

• Lecture: 'Sex Toys and Soldiers: Life in the US Military Sexual Complex'

The Prince Alwaleed Bin Talal Bin Abdulaziz Alsaud Center for American Studies and Research (CASAR) at the American University of Beirut is organizing a lecture by Dr. Winddance Twine, UC Santa Barbara entitled: "Sex Toys and Soldiers: Life in the US Military Sexual Complex" on Tuesday, March 19, 2013 at 6:00 pm in Building 37, Conference Room A.

The screening of the film "The Invisible War' in 2012 introduced civilians to the plight of female and male soldiers who have been treated almost like 'sex toy's - that is sexually abused by their commanding officers and their male peers. In this talk, Winddance will draw on current research on militarism, gender inequality and poverty to provide a critical analysis of the situation of female soldiers serving in the US Armed Forces. Despite recent changes in the US Military Code of Justice and the recent establishment of new Special Victims Units (SUVS) to handle sexual assault cases, the US Armed Services remains a 'gendered organization' that has been structured around specific notions of masculinity and gendered hierarchies. Drawing upon memoirs by female veterans, Department of Defense reports, sociological surveys of female soldiers and feminist theory, she will dissect the challenged that the US Armed Services faces as their increased dependency on women to serve has brought to attention the degree to which sexual violence has become a normative experience for both new recruits and experienced soldiers - that is, exposure to sexual assault has become a condition of employment, a labor condition that has been, until recently, tolerated by the male leadership.

France Winddance Twine is Professor of Sociology and documentary filmmaker at the University of California, Santa Barbara. She is the former deputy editor of American Sociological Review, the flagship journal of the American Sociological Association. Twine currently serves as a member of the International editorial boards of Sciology, the official journal of the British Sociological Association and the Identites: Global Studies in Culture and Power. Twine's research examines the intersections of racial, gender, and class inequalities. Her recent publications include *Girls With Guns: Firearms, Feminisim and Militarism* (2012) and *Geographies of Privilage* (2013)
