



Preface

Dear All

The academic year 2013-2014 was yet again a good year for FAFS, shaped by remarkable advances on several fronts at the Faculty. One of our main areas of emphasis is quality education. After diligent efforts, and to our collective delight, the *undergraduate Nutrition and Dietetics Coordinated Program (NDCP)* was accredited by the Accreditation Council for Education in Nutrition and Dietetics (ACEND) in November 2013. Upholding our tradition of being the "Faculty of Firsts", the NDCP is the first and only nutrition program in the entire Middle East to obtain a U.S. accreditation, and the third in the world to receive accreditation outside the U.S. This prestigious international recognition of the NDCP is a significant compliment to the didactic Nutrition and Dietetics track at NFSC, which has successfully completed an external review last year.

Under the same initiative of quality education, the NFSC department initiated the development of a Food Science program eligible for approval by the US-based Institute of Food Technologists (IFT). Likewise, other departments at FAFS were busy with the development of programs in line with current trends and job market needs: the Agriculture department (AGRI)- a merger of the departments of Agricultural Sciences and Animal and Veterinary Sciences- started to work on the proposal of an inter-faculty degree of Doctor in Veterinary Medicine jointly with the Faculty of Medicine, and the LDEM department has continued its efforts in developing a graduate program in Landscape Architecture in accordance with the American Society of Landscape Architects' (ASLA) standards of accreditation. The graduate program in Rural Community Development (RCODE) was launched in fall 2014, and the curriculum of a Diploma in Food Security was finalized and classes are set to begin in June 2015.

Our research profile is progressing steadily. This year, a total of 1,391,455 USD in grants were secured from internal, local, regional, and international public and private institutions, including Nestle Middle East, ICARDA, UNIFERT, and UNESCWA to name a few. Our faculty published fifty-two papers in internationally refereed journals, averaging 2.1 publications per faculty member, an improvement from last year's 1.29.

The Faculty is committed to addressing global challenges such as nutrition and non-communicable disease, food safety, food security, and sustainable agriculture. In the past year, it has hosted several seminars and workshops in collaboration with internal, local, regional, and international public and private institutions such as the Issam Fares Institute, the Ministry of Public Health, UNICEF, and Purdue University. Two noteworthy training sessions were delivered: the first tackled the use of the national food based dietary guidelines (developed by the NFSC department)

targeting primary health care providers, and the second on conservation agriculture targeting Lebanese universities' students.

FAFS has extended its network of partnerships, whereby two new MOU agreements were signed with ICARDA for the provision of additional land and facilities for research and for the establishment of three Gene Bank rooms, in addition to the one established last year. An Urban Greening Research Group (UGRG) has been established to conduct research and outreach activities on urban and sustainable greening, using AUB as a showcase of their work.

During the annual year 2013/2014, FAFS welcomed two new faculty members: a Visiting Assistant Professor at the AGRI department and an Assistant Professor at LDEM.

Our visibility and marketing efforts were under review this year; Dr. Salma Talhouk was appointed as Associate Dean and progressed towards developing a visibility strategy for FAFS, including rebranding and profile building. Also, we are working closely with the Office of Advancement to collect funds to: renovate wing B, support the Food Security Program, develop an ECO-UNIT, and establish a biotechnology laboratory.

Last year was thus a busy and productive year, as you will find in the following pages. I would like to thank all faculty and staff for their hard work in support of academic excellence, our students for their outstanding efforts and you, our friends and alumni, for your continued support.

The committee held thirteen meetings throughout 2013-2014, and the following actions were taken:

1. Food Security and Policy Education Program (FOSPEP)

The FOSPEP was discussed, and the committee agreed to have the administrative placement of the FOSPEP under the FAFS Dean's Office.

2. FAFS Reserch Seed Funding (RSF) Guidelines

The newly developed guidelines for the FAFS- RSF were presented and approved.

3. Capital Budget

The committee approved priority requests submitted by FAFS departments and AREC for the capital budget 2014–2015.

4. Graduate Assistants

The committee approved the appointment of graduate assistants in the various FAFS departments for the fall, spring, and summer terms.

5. Funding Priority for USAID ASHA Grant

The committee held fifteen meetings throughout the period from September 1, 2013 to August 31, 2014. The following actions were taken:

1. Faculty Research Leave

The committee approved the following applications: fifteen short term faculty development grants; one junior faculty research leave; one long term faculty development leave; one periodic paid research leave; one leave without pay; and thirty special leaves with pay.

2. New Appointments

 NFSC department; seventeen in the LDEM department, twenty eight in the
 AGRI department and one for the RCODE Program
- The committee approved the appointment of Dr. Rami Zurayk as chairperson
 of the LDEM department for a period of three years as of January 1, 2014.
 The committee also approved the appointment of Dr. Lara Nasreddine as
 chairperson of the NFSC department for a period of three years beginning
 fall 2014/2015.

Actions

The committee met ten times during the academic year 2013-2014, and the following actions were taken:

Approved Requirements for 2nd BS Degree in Agribusiness for Agriculture Students

The committee approved the course requirements to be taken by Agriculture graduates wishing to pursue a 2nd BS in Agribusiness

2. Approved course offerings and introduction of new courses

The committee approved and modified spring, summer and fall course offerings. It also approved the following new courses:

- AVSC 260 "Introduction to Laboratory Animal Science and Management" (3 cr.) to be offered during fall 2014-2015 as elective.
- AVSC 230 "Animal Health and Diseases" (3 cr.) to be offered during fall 2014-15 as elective.

3. Eligible students to go to AREC

Twenty- six students from the Agriculture program were deemed eligible to go to AREC during the spring semester of 2013-2014; classes started on February 17, 2014. Twenty-eight students from the Landscape program were deemed eligible to go to AREC during the summer semester which started on May 26, 2014.

4. Reactivation of AVSC 213, Comparative Vertebrate Anatomy

The committee agreed to reactivate and offer the course AVSC 213 (Comparative Anatomy) during fall 2014-2015.

5. Approved Curricular Revision of the BSc in Nutrition & Dietetics and the Nutrition & Dietetics - Coordinated Program

The committee approved the new revised BSc curricula in Nutrition and Dietetics and the Nutrition and Dietetics – Coordinated Program effective fall 2014-2015.

6. New Master Program - Food Security & Policy Education Program (FOSEP)

The committee discussed the new Master's Program "Food Security & Policy Education Program" (FOSEP) and approved the following:

- The Diploma in Food Security
- The Master's Program and Executive Master in Food Security
- Changing the name from Food Security and Policy Education Program to Food Security

7. Probation

Based on AUB probation rules and regulations, the committee acted to drop six students during the academic year 2013-2014: eight students were placed on strict probation, and three students were removed from probation.

8. Awarding BS degrees

The committee recommended to the Faculty to award BS degrees to 115 students distributed as follows: 27 in Nutrition and Dietetics, 15 in Nutrition and Dietetics – Coordinated Program, 23 in Food Science and Management, 21 in Landscape Design and Eco-Management and Diploma of *Ingenieur Agricole*, 16 in Agriculture and Diploma of *Ingenieur Agricole*, and 13 in Agribusiness.

Acceptance of Transfer Students

Actions:

The committee met nine times during the academic year 2013-2014, and acted on the following:

1. Program of study and thesis titles

The committee reviewed and approved the program of study and thesis titles of thirty-one students distributed as follows: 16 from NUTR; 4 from FTCH; 3 from ECOM; 1 from ANML; 1 from AGEC; 2 from POSC; 1 from PLPT; and 3 from PLSC.

2. Acceptance of graduate students

The committee accepted sixty four students out of 113 applicants. Of the accepted candidates, 23 students enrolled as follows: 4 Nutrition; 3 Food Technology; 4 Ecosystem Management; 5 Plant Protection; 1 Irrigation; 1 Agricultural Economics; 1 Plant Science; and 4 Animal Science.

3. Summer applicants

The committee discussed summer applications and decided not to accept summer applicants effective summer 2014-2015 since courses are not offered in the summer term.

4. Petitions

The committee acted on eight petitions from students, the majority of which included: changing from thesis to non-thesis; changing status from prospective graduate to regular graduate; extending residency; conducting comprehensive exam via Skype; considering a graduate application; and registering 12 credits during summer.

5. Proposal for MS in Environmental Studies

Dr. Zurayk briefed the committee on the new proposal for the Master of Environmental Studies degree to be offered by the Division of University Interdisciplinary Program (DUIP). Comments and suggestions were made by the committee.

6. New Elective Graduate Courses in LDEM

The committee approved the following new elective graduate courses to be offered by the LDEM department: Sustainable Landscape Planning and Management (LDEM/ENSC 634), and Political Ecology of Water (LDEM/ENSC 635).

7. Probation

The committee acted to drop one student during the academic year 2013-2014. Three students were removed from probation.

8. New Diploma and Master's Program – Food Security & Policy Education Program (FOSPEP)

The committee discussed the new Master's Program Food Security & Policy Education Program (FOSEP) and recommended the approval of the following:

- The Diploma in Food Security effective summer 2014-15
- The Master's Program and Executive Master in Food Security

9. Awarding the MS degree

The committee recommended that the Faculty award the MS degree to thirty-four students in their respective majors: 13 in Nutrition; 9 in Food Technology; 4 in Ecosystem Management; 2 in Poultry Science; 2 in Plant Science; 1 in Irrigation; 1 in Animal Science; and 1 in Plant Protection.

The committee met two times between the period of September , 2013 until August 31, 2014, and voted on several items. The committee discussed disciplinary actions and FAFS awards, and the following recommendations were made to the Dean:

1. Disciplinary Actions

- The FAFS Student Affairs Committee voted to deny the accusation of cheating against undergraduate student and to decline the request for a disciplinary action due to lack of physical evidence and absence of testimonies by witnesses.

• Dean Nuhad Dagher FAFS Graduate Student Award:


The committee recommended **Mr. George Nassif**, Poultry Science graduate to receive this award.

• Penrose Award

An e-mail was sent to the departmental chairpersons to nominate candidates for this award. Only two candidates were nominated by the Nutrition and Food Sciences department, **Ms. Linda Said**, undergraduate Nutrition and Dietetics-Coordinator Program and **Ms. Cherine Fawaz**, undergraduate

Food Science and Management. After reviewing the records and the presentation of the nominees, candidates' performances were graded by the committee (from 1 to 5), then the total scores were calculated. Based on the highest grade received, the committee recommended to the FAFS faculty to grant the Penrose Award to Ms. Linda Said. The faculty voted for Ms. Linda Said.

A. Academic Matters

Faculty Recruitment and Count

The total number of Faculty Full Time Equivalent (FTE's) for the academic year 2013-2014 was 39.95, of which twenty five were full-time faculty of professorial rank (11 professors, 1 visiting professor, 5 associate professors and 8 assistant professors).

During the academic year 2013-2014, FAFS advanced its recruitment activities by advertising for five professorial lines (Agribusiness; Sports and Clinical Nutrition; Biostatistics and Landscape Architecture). Of these, one was filled at the AGRI (Visiting Assistant Professor for the academic year 2014-2015).

Faculty Affairs

FAFS hosted the inaugural Aana Prizes in Agribusiness on May 19, 2014. The Aana Prizes recognize outstanding achievement by agribusiness students at AUB in the categories of Benefit to Community and Innovation, and encourage students to launch careers in the field following their studies. During its annual gala dinner in November, the WAAAUB FAFS Chapter honored four alumni for their professional achievements, they are: Mr. Fuad Fleifil and Drs. Nadim Khouri, Rabi Mohtar, and Robert Rouda.

International Teaching Collaboration: Simultaneous overseas teaching has been launched for the first time at FAFS. The joint face to face via internet teaching exercise was led by Dr. Yaser Abunnasr from the LDEM department at AUB and Dr. Jack Ahern from the Landscape Architecture and Regional Planning Department at UMASS Amherst.

Published Papers: A total of fifty- two papers were published in international refereed journals: 21 in NFSC, 25 in AGSI and 6 in LDEM. The overall trend for publications per faculty member is 2.08, which is higher than that of last year (1.29).

Administrative Restructuring: At the administrative level, the departments of Agricultural Sciences and Animal and Veterinary Sciences were merged into the department of Agriculture. This merger will:

- 1. Provide better visibility for students, funding, research and services.
- 2. Improve efficiency in using human, financial and physical resources.
- 3. Create a critical mass of faculty for research synergy.

Research Grants and Service Contracts: During this period, FAFS faculty members were successful in attracting research funding from internal, local, regional and international agencies for the total amount of \$1,810,156. Grants awarded by Nestle Middle East amounted to 50% of the total for projects headed by Dr. Hwalla in the

field of Nutrition research and awareness. The remainder is divided among FAFS departments. ICARDA's land rent contract amounted to \$108,176.5, while UNIFERT's land rent contract reached the amount of \$30,000.

Accreditation, Program Reviews and New Programs

The undergraduate Nutrition and Dietetics Coordinated Program (NDCP) was accredited by the Accreditation Council for Education in Nutrition and Dietetics (ACEND) in November 2013. The NDCP is the first and only nutrition program in the entire Middle East to obtain a U.S. accreditation and the third in the world to receive accreditation outside the U.S. This prestigious international recognition of the NDCP is a significant compliment to the didactic Nutrition and Dietetics track at NFSC, which has successfully completed an external review last year.

The AGRI department finalized a self-study of its Agriculture Program, and external reviewers conducted an on-site assessment in February 2014. The reviewers' exit report was submitted to the Provost, and final recommendations by the University's Academic Assessment Unit are currently being addressed by the department.

BLA: The LDEM department has submitted a self-study of its BLA Program to NYSED as part of the registration requirements in New York State.

At the academic level, and in line with the Faculty's strategic initiative for establishing new programs that address issues of local and global relevance, the new MS in Rural Community and Development (RCODE) program secured NYSED registration and will be launched in fall 2014-2015.

The NFSC department developed two proposals for undergraduate degrees; the first one in Food Engineering that will allow graduates to register at the Syndicate of Engineers, and the second in Food Science that will qualify graduates for membership in the International Food Technologists Organization and certification from the International Union of Food Science and Technology.

FAFS is also developing three new graduate programs, including an inter-faculty Doctor in Veterinary Medicine program through a joint task force with the Faculty of Medicine, and a Master in Landscape Architecture at the LDEM department. In addition, the Faculty approved the proposal for a Master of Science in Food Security. The program will be launched once University approvals and NYSED registration are complete.

Visibility and Advancement

Visibility

Dr. Salma Talhouk was appointed as Associate Dean as of January 2014 to strengthen FAFS visibility. Since her appointment, Dr. Talhouk has developed comprehensive strategic priority themes for the Faculty (Food security, Environmental resilience and Nutrition for health) which received faculty wide consensus following two faculty retreats. Dr. Talhouk has developed FAFS working relations by relaying FAFS strategic orientation to the offices of communication, advancement, and alumni affairs as ground preparation for improved visibility and fundraising ability. She has also launched the Faculty e-newsletter.

Advancement, Fund Raising and Endowment Funds

FAFS is working closely with the Office of Advancement in support of the University's fundraising campaign for Wing B. Furthermore, fundraising opportunities are being pursued in collaboration with the Office of Advancement to support FAFS Food Security Program, the development of FAFS ECO-UNIT, and the establishment of a biotechnology laboratory.

Recognition

The following faculty members received awards for their professional achievements:

The research entitled "Dietary patterns and odds of type 2 diabetes in Beirut, Lebanon: A case-control study" authored by Drs. Farah Naja, Nahla Hwalla, Leila Itani, Maya Salem, Sami Azar (Faculty of Medicine) and Maya Nabhani Zeidan, received the 2012 C.A. and C.C. Rebeiz Award, that is dedicated for promoting research at FAFS.

Dr. Mohamad Farran received the 2013 CNRS Research Excellence Award on food security and safety.

Dean Hwalla was awarded the 2014 Susan Bulkeley Butler Leadership Excellence Award by the International Breast Cancer and Nutrition group at Purdue University.

Dr. Jala Makhzoumi, Associate to the LDEM department, was awarded the 2013 Tamayouz Award for outstanding women architects in Iraq in October 2013.

FAFS Brown Bag Seminar

Dr. Hadi Jaafar gave a presentation on "Food security from space: A geospatial analysis of the effect of Syrian conflict on agriculture" on March 7, 2014.

Seminars

In line with FAFS's global themes, seminars, workshops, and symposia were organized addressing food safety, food security, and nutrition and non-communicable diseases. In collaboration with the International Breast Cancer and Nutrition (Purdue University), the NFSC department organized the 4th IBCN symposium on "Genes, the Environment and Breast Cancer Risk" and hosted a day of public lectures entitled "Prevent and Treat Breast Cancer: the Role of Nutrition". The AGSI department hosted Professor Emeritus Dr. Robert Zimdahl (from Colorado State University) to present a lecture on "Ethics in Agricultural Science". In collaboration with colleagues from the MOPH and UNICEF, Dr. Lamis Jomaa of the NFSC department, organized a training workshop on the "Optimal Implementation of the Food-Based Dietary Guidelines for Lebanese Adults" targeting primary health care providers in Lebanon. Through a project entitled "Impact of Population Growth and Climate Change in Lebanon and Egypt on Water Scarcity, Agricultural Output and Food Security," Dr. Nadim Farajalla of the LDEM department, organized two expert consultation workshops in collaboration with the Issam Fares Institute.

Visiting URB Scholar Dr. Isabelle Romieu, Head of the Nutritional Epidemiology Group at the International Agency for Research on Cancer, visited the NFSC department where she presented three lectures entitled "Can we prevent breast cancer: what the evidence shows", "Cancer prevention strategies in relation to the obesity epidemic: Research priorities", and "Fatty acids and breast cancer".

Faculty meetings

During the period September 1st, 2013–August 31st, 2014, four regular faculty meetings were held at FAFS, and the following actions were taken:

3. Curricular Revision:

The Faculty approved the revised curricula of the B.Sc. in Nutrition and Dietetics and the Nutrition and Dietetics-Coordinated Program.

B. Student Statistics

Student Enrollment (2013-2014):

The total undergraduate student enrolment in the Faculty for the year 2013-2014 was 553 distributed as follows: 101 in Agriculture, 178 in Nutrition and Dietetics, 30 in Nutrition and Dietetics-Coordinated Program, 76 in Landscape Design and Ecosystem Management, 95 in Food Science and Management, and 73 in Agribusiness. The undergraduate enrolment in 2013-2014was approximately the same as in 2012-2013.

The total graduate student enrolment in 2013-2014 was 96 and 14% lower than that of 2012-2013 (111 students). This was mainly due to a drop in the number of newly admitted students. The vast majority of the graduate enrolment was in the NFSC department (55) and the remaining were distributed among AGSC (19), LDEM (14) and AVSC (8) departments.

Historical Perspective (2013-2014):

Undergraduate enrolment decreased from 658 in the AY 2009-2010 to 553 in the AY 2013-2014 due to the low enrolment of newly admitted students and the increase in the number of students transferring from the Faculty at the Junior and Senior levels. The undergraduate enrolment in the past 5 years is shown in Table 5.

Student Admissions (2013-2014):

Undergraduate New Applicants:

During the academic year 2013-2014, a total of 2291 new applications were received at FAFS, of which 38% were accepted and 14% of the accepted enrolled. In the fall semester of 2013-2014, the yield of admittance was 13% (104 enrolled out of 831 accepted students), whereas in the spring semester of 2013-2014, the yield of admittance was 33% (14 enrolled out of 43 accepted students). The number of enrolled undergraduate students was 118 and 30% lower than that in 2012-2013 (168 students). This decrease was mainly in the AGRI, LDEM and AGBU programs and might have been caused by the political instability in the region. Table 7 shows the numbers and percentages of undergraduate new students who applied to the different FAFS programs, those who were admitted and those who enrolled in fall and spring 2013-2014.

Undergraduate Transfer Applicants:

During the academic year 2013-2014, a total of 294 transfer applications were received at FAFS, of which 154 (52%) were accepted with 60 (39%) of those accepted having enroled. Graduate Applicants:

During the academic year 2013-2014, a total of 113 graduate applications were received at FAFS, of which 64 (57%) were accepted and 23 (36%) of those accepted enroled. Graduation (2013-2014):

FAFS graduated 115 undergraduate students in the AY 2013-2014 distributed over the different majors as follows: Nutrition and Dietetics (27), Nutrition and Dietetics – Coordinated Program (15), Food Science and Management (23), Landscape Design and Ecosystem Management (21), Agriculture (13) and Agribusiness (16).

FAFS also graduated 32 graduate students distributed over the different programs as follows: Nutrition (12), Food Technology (11), Ecosystem Management (2), Irrigation (1), Plant Protection (3), Plant Sciences (1), Animal Science (1) and Poultry Science (1). The average number of M.S. graduates over the last five years was 30 students. Research: "Value chain analysis of wheat landraces and wheat-based traditional food in relation to Agro-biodiversity"

The research is funded by the National Council for Scientific Research. The objective is to assess the production chain of selected local traditional food products in relation to Agro-biodiversity conservation. More specifically, the production of Borghol and Keshek is assessed in relation to the varieties of wheat landraces and the type of milk used in the process. The research will analyze the origin of (genetic) resource and the agricultural practices of wheat, the processing practices of Keshek, the types of milk used, and the marketing channels based on a survey conducted in two different regions producing Keshek in Lebanon (North-Bekaa and Shouf).

Regional Networking: "KariaNet"

Knowledge Access for Rural Inter-connected Areas Network, is a regional network funded by IDRC and IFAD for the management and sharing of knowledge, information and experience in agriculture and rural development in the Middle East and North Africa (MENA) region. A competitive call for an expression of interest to host KariaNet was launched, and the ESDU was selected to be the hosting organization. ESDU is

assuming the responsibility of moderating the regional knowledge management network. This Network, inspired by 'open access principles', seeks to empower its members, through the use of ICT and non-ICT tools, to make knowledge available and timely accessible to farmers and practitioners involved in rural development.

Capacity Building: "Mainstreaming evaluation: Theory and practice in the MENA region"

The project is funded by IDRC and provides capacity development, small R&D grants for MENA specific evaluation research and publications, "Arabization" of evaluation methodologies and publications as well as virtual and face-to-face meeting and networking opportunities. One of the positive unintended outcomes of the project was the emergence of the first MENA Professional Association on Development Evaluation ("EvalMENA"). ESDU developed the first of its kind, the On-line Training Course on Development Evaluation in Arabic (together with EvalMENA members from Jordan, Egypt, Lebanon, Palestine and Saudi Arabia), which contributed to the scientific material and the oversight of the entire project along with the International Organization on Cooperation in Evaluation (IOCE) and the technical support of UNICEF, which has been instrumental in providing the e-learning platform. It can be accessed on: http://www.mymande.org/elearning.

Workshop:"Mainstreaming evaluation:Theory and practice in the MENA region"

ESDU organized in Amman, Jordan the closing workshop of the project "Mainstreaming evaluation theory and practice in the MENA region". Eighty three participants from thirteen different nationalities attended the conference, among whom six parliamentarians representing Algeria, Egypt, Jordan, Morocco, Palestine and Tunisia. The latter had launched the MENA Parliamentarian Forum on Development Evaluation. Dr. Ibrahim Seif, Jordanian Minister of Planning and International Cooperation, delivered the keynote address of the conference, stressing the role of evaluation in improving development effectiveness and evidence-based policy making.

Community Development:

"Souk O Shouf" farmers' market design project exhibition

ESDU and the department of Landscape and Ecosystem management organized a design competition for landscape students for the implementation of a farmers' market in Multaka el Nahreyn in the Shouf area. The exhibition was held in cooperation with the Al Shouf Cedar Society and in the presence of Mrs Nora Joumblat who presented the prizes to the first four winners of the competition.

"Souk aal Souk promoting nutrition education in universities and organic agriculture in wakf land"

This project aims at implementing a series of farmers' markets to promote local organic and healthy products and build linkages between small-scale producers and urban residents, as well as training producers on good agricultural practices and organizational and managerial skills to sustain the market. It builds on a previously funded project by Waterfront City- Cares (Majed Al Futaim Holding) which started in 2012.

"Community-based healthy kitchens" to provide locally-produced food aid for vulnerable groups affected by the Syrian Crisis

A partnership with the International Orthodox Christian Charity (IOCC) was initiated through pilot activities to establish community kitchens where ESDU implemented trainings for women on food safety practices and managerial skills. A kitchen in Minyara, Akkar led by Syrian and Lebanese women to provide food aid was established in May 2013.

"School feeding program in Bourj Al Barajneh"

In partnership with CRPH/FHS, ESDU contributed to a school feeding program in Bourj Al Barajneh by building the capacities of women who were to lead a healthy kitchen that will be linked to schools in the camp. The project started in June 2014.

New Academic Program: "The RCODE Master of Sciences program in Rural Community Development"

ESDU under the FAFS is hosting a graduate program leading to the degree of Master of Science (MS) in Rural Community Development (RCODE, thesis or non-thesis). The RCODE program, initially developed in 2003, was updated and approved by the Faculty of Agricultural and Food Sciences and the AUB administration. It was registered at the Lebanese Ministry of Higher Education. The program was positively reviewed and evaluated by Dr. David Brown from Cornell University (Professor at the department of Development Sociology and co-Director of the Community and Regional Development Institute CaRDI at Cornell University). The RCODE was registered in New York State Education Department and launched in September 2014. FAFS is one of the few academic institutions in the MENA region to offer a rural community development program.

- To attract students for the RCODE Master program
- To sustain KariaNet regional knowledge management network
- To place Local Food Systems on the regional and international food security agenda

A. Department of Agricultural Sciences

Highlights

The department completed the Agriculture program review process by hosting two invited reviewers for a three-day visit. The reviewers revised the old and the proposed new Agriculture curricula, visited the facilities, held group and individual meetings with faculty, students and staff. They presented their full report and recommendations to which the department and the Dean presented their detailed feedback, and the process was completed with the final recommendations of the University Review Committee.

- The merger of the Animal and Veterinary Sciences and the Agricultural Sciences departments was completed. A new department of Agriculture was formed.
- The department research committee set a research strategy for the department.

B. Department of Landscape Design & Ecosystem Management

Highlights

The LDEM department consists of eight full-time faculty members: four faculty from the sciences field and four from the design field. Every term, and based on need, the department draws on part-time design faculty members. Two programs are currently offered by LDEM: the undergraduate Bachelor of Landscape Architecture (BLA), and the graduate Masters of Sciences in Ecosystem Management (ECOM) degree, which is offered jointly with the Interfaculty Graduate Environmental Sciences Program (IGESP). In the AY 2013-2014, LDEM graduated twenty undergraduate students and four graduate students.

Department Academic Activities

• Development of a Master of Landscape Architecture (MLA) program: A sub-committee composed of Bengs, Makhzoumi, Trovato (chair of the committee), and Zurayk revised and finalized the draft document that was completed in spring 2012-2013. The degree is open to all undergraduate fields with an advanced status for holders of design degrees and is license-awarding. The program is aligned with the American Society of Landscape Architects (ASLA) guidelines. Status in progress (expected completion date: fall 2014-2015).

- Bachelor of Landscape Architecture (BLA) program registration at New York State of Education (NYSED): the proposal/self-study of the Bachelor of Landscape Architecture (BLA) program was submitted to NYSED during fall 2013-2014 for approval and registration. During September 2013, the department received comments from NYSED based on the outcome of the State Board meeting held on August 27th, 2014. The department replied to all comments and is now waiting for NYSED decision.
- Completion of self-study document to be submitted for accreditation: the self-study program (completed during fall 2013-2014) will be submitted to the American Society of Landscape Architects (ASLA) for accreditation of the undergraduate program as soon as its registration in the New York State of Education (NYSED) is approved.
- Program review document to be submitted to the University: the department
 and the program review committee (N. Farajalla, chair of committee; Y.
 Abunnasr and N. Al-Akl) finalized the program review document that was
 submitted in October 2014 to the University Program Review Committee
 (PRC) and for review by external reviewers (completed and submitted on
 October 28, 2014).
- Sub-committee for Program Learning Outcomes (PLOs) and Course Learning Outcomes (CLOs) assessment was formed: the committee that included Abunnasr (chair), Al-Akl and Farajalla, reviewed and finalized the CLOs and administered the evaluation for fall and spring 2013-2014.
- Sub-committee for a new science-based Master's degree related to the landscape architecture profession: the committee chaired by Zurayk, is in the process of defining the academic scope of the degree. It was formed in fall 2013-2014, and included Bengs, Makhzoumi, Trovato and Zurayk.
- Department research strategy: the Chair initiated the process of compiling a research strategy for the department led by **Bengs** and was finalized at the end of the spring term 2013-2014.

New and Visiting Faculty

- New Faculty: Professor Christer Bengs joined the department as Visiting Professor for the period of two years effective fall 2013/2014. Dr. Bengs was Chief Researcher at Aalto University, School of Engineering (Finland) and he had requested to delay his appointment from fall 2012/2013 until fall 2013/2014.
- Visiting Faculty: Landscape Architect Ms. Sareh Moosavi joined the department as Visiting Lecturer for the period of one term (spring 2013-

2014). Ms. Moosavi is a Landscape Architect; she has an MLA (Masters of Landscape Architecture) from Shahid Beheshti University (Tehran, Iran) and is currently continuing her PhD in Landscape Architecture at the University of Melbourne, Australia.

New Appointments

- Appointment of New Department Chair: In January 2014, R. Zurayk was appointed as Chairperson of the LDEM department and S. Talhouk was appointed as FAFS Associate Dean.
- Change of Faculty Status: the status of Visiting Assistant Professor Yaser
 Abunnasr was changed to Assistant Professor effective September 2013. Dr.
 Abunnasr received his PhD in Regional Planning from the University of
 Massachusetts, Amherst, USA in June 2013.

Advertised Positions

Due to the low number of applications and the lack of qualified candidates, the LDEM department re-advertised for the vacant faculty position in Landscape Architecture for the academic year 2014-2015 (deadline March 15, 2014). The advertisement was revised and posted on FAFS website, Inside Higher Ed and the Council of Educators in Landscape Architecture (CELA), in addition to the following journals: Landscape Journal (University of Wisconsin Press, USA), Landscape Research (UK) and TOPOS Magazine –the international Review of Landscape Architecture and Urban Design (Munich, Germany). Four qualified applications were received; the review and selection process started in April 2014. Three candidates were interviewed in June 2014. Dr. Mehran Madani was invited for a job talk and a design charrette in September 2014.

Extracurricular Activities

LDEM Faculty members conducted numerous activities to enhance student learning experience including:

Landworks Sardinia: this is the fourth time AUB students, supervised by M.
G. Trovato, carry out this activity jointly with international students lead by international professors with the aim, this year, of designing and executing a landscape intervention in La Maddalena, Italy (May 22 to June 2, 2014).

Landscape Dialogues 2014: Two Landscape Dialogue events were organized. The first event was organized in collaboration with the Center for Civic Engagement and Community Service (CCECS), and consisted of an exhibition of student projects featuring the outcome of an interdisciplinary collaboration between AUB students from the LDEM department (LDEM 228- year III), and AUC (American University in Cairo) students from the

English and Comparative Literature department. The event took place on December 2, 2013. The student teams used the third year LDEM students' projects (from "the Site Design in the Urban Context Studio-LDEM 228") as the basis for their collaboration. They conducted a joint field visit to the project site, exchanged ideas, debated issues, and learned to work in a cross-disciplinary environment. The student projects theme was to explore public landscape issues. The event was organized by third year design studio teachers, **R. Shibli, and M.G. Trovato** and was sponsored by AUB's Provost office.

During April 28 to May 3, 2014, another Landscape Dialogue took place featuring interdisciplinary collaboration and student projects exhibition between AUB (LDEM 204- second year LDEM students) and AUC students. Students conducted joint field visits to the LDEM student project sites in the Nahr Ibrahim river area, exchanged ideas, debated issues, and learned to work in a cross-disciplinary environment. Students from the University Scholarship Program (USP) and the U.S. Middle East Partnership Initiative (MEPI) students also joined the workshop and site visits. The event was organized by second year design studio teachers, **R. Shibli**, **B. Al-Amine** and **S. Moosavi**.

- Student studio outcome presentation: the third year landscape architecture students, supervised by their instructors C. Bengs and M. Chahine, gave a presentation on April 28, 2014 exposing the final outcome of their studio work "Cultural and Historical Landscapes" (LDEM 204), dealing with the planning and protection of downtown Beirut, the Solidere area. The aspect of protection is not only related to the single monuments of the place, but to the urban morphology as well. The presentation encompassed a historical review of the area and the way the present reconstruction has emerged. It included possible solutions conceptualized according to by-laws and illustrated by visual renderings. Alternative modes for developing and administrating the area were proposed as well.
- Student work exhibition: Landscape Descriptive Drawing (LDEM 201) instructors (N. Al-Akl, R. Mezherand S. Moosavi) and students organized a student work exhibition on May 14th 2014, in FAFS Wing A, Science Library Hallway, to showcase some of the best work produced by the students throughout the semester.
- IBDAA: the LDEM students group in the final year "Site Engineering III Design Implementation" (LDEM 249) course won, with the project titled "The Bottled Landscape: the Floating Garden", the first prize competition (2000USD) at the IBDAA event organized yearly by the Nature Conservation Center (NCC) under the Arts and Humanities category. The event took place on April 25th 2014.

- Abillamaa entrepreneurship award: Ecosystem Management (ECOM) graduate student, Sara Moledor, was announced as the winner of the first AUB eco-entrepreneurship award (June 9, 2014). The award is administered by the Nature Conservation Center (NCC) at AUB. Ms. Moledor used earthworms to develop an eco- and business-friendly composting method, which landed her the grand prize (20,000USD).
- Garden show 2014: Under the supervision and coordination of N. Al-Akl, LDEM students designed and implemented the department stand at the Beirut Garden Show Spring Festival. This yearly event was held during May 27-31, 2014 at the Beirut Hyppodrome.
- International teaching collaboration: Simultaneous overseas teaching: An exploratory collaboration between AUB/LDEM (Y.Abunnasr) and UMASS Amherst/LARP (Dr. Jack Ahern) was explored during spring 2013-2014. The setting: two classes, two universities, 9,000 km apart, face to face via internet. The concept is to have full visual and audio with live seminar discussions and teaching.
- Annual plant sale: S. Talhouk, M. Fabian and LDEM I students organized, as part of an experiential learning experience on plants and people, the department's annual plant sale in front of AUB's West Hall on April 11, 2014. The sales generated was deposited in the department's revolving fund to sustain experiential learning activities.

Al-Amine, R. Shibli and S. Moosavi) as part of LDEM 204 design studio (Cultural and Historical Landscapes) on February 10, 2014.
- Public lecture on "Current and Future Trends in Landscape Contracting" was
 given by invited speaker, AUB alumnus Vicken Apelian, Chief Executive
 Officer (CEO) of Apelinc Landscape Services, Inc in California, USA. The
 lecture which was organized by LDEM (S. Talhouk and Y. Abunnasr) on
 March 14, 2014, was attended by LDEM faculty and students.

- Public lecture entitled "Water Features in the Landscape" organized by
 the department (H. Chmaitelly) on April 10, 2014, was given by AUB
 alumnus Khalil Boueri, Chairman of "Fluid Design, Watermaster, Al Miyah
 Holding Group", which is one of the leaders in the MENA region in electromechanical systems, and water management in general, water features
 designs and implementation, in particular.
- Regional workshops in Lebanon and Cairo: the LDEM department (N. Farajalla, Faculty Research Director of the Climate Change and Environment in the Arab World Program at the Issam Fares Institute for Public Policy and International Affairs-IFI) in collaboration with the Issam Fares Institute (IFI), organized two experts consultation workshops (September 23 and November 1, 2013) and attended a workshop at AUC in Egypt (November 11-14, 2013) as part of a project entitled "Impact of population growth and climate change in Lebanon and Egypt on water scarcity, agricultural output and food security". Another workshop was held on April 9, 2014 as part of the same AUB-IFI project within the framework of the IFI's Climate Change and the Environment in the Arab World Program, and in collaboration with the American University of Cairo (AUC) and the Columbia University Middle East Research Center (CUMERC) based in Jordan.

Involvement in interdisciplinary and interfaculty activities

LDEM faculty members were actively involved in university wide centers, programs and activities:

• Farmers' market design: the Environment and Sustainable Development Unit at FAFS (ESDU) and representatives from Waterfront City Cares distributed awards and certificates to LDEM students who contributed to the Farmers' Market Student Design Presentations (under the supervision of Y. Abunnasr) of the project entitled "Promotion of organic and local healthy products through a weekly farmers' market" during February 2013. The event took place on October 11, 2013.

The Environment and Sustainable Development Unit (ESDU) and LDEM organized a second student design presentations for a new Farmers' market in collaboration with Al-Shouf Cedar Society (under the supervision of **M.G. Trovato**). The first year students' designs were presented at the "Souk O Shouf" showcase event on May 12, 2014 at the FAFS olive garden.

Initiative for AUB arboretum and botanic garden: the department (S. Talhouk and Y. Abunnasr) is leading a university wide initiative to launch AUB arboretum and botanic garden. In addition to S. Talhouk, the committee in charge consists of ten other members from different AUB faculties and units and AUB friends as follows: Anis Abdallah (Grounds and Transfer services), Tamer Amin (Associate Professor and SMEC Director -Science

and Mathematics Education Center), Yaser Abunnasr (Landscape Planning, LDEM), George Battikha (Landscape Horticulture, LDEM), Christer Bengs (Landscape Architecture and Urban Planning, LDEM), Kathy Dorman (AUB Community), Monika Fabian (Instructor, LDEM), Rafi Ohanian (Alumnus, Al Ryum Contracting & Trading Company), Mariam Sabaah (Associate Director of Development - Special Projects: Office of the Vice President for University Advancement), Nada Sinno Saoud (Lecturer, Department of Biology/Curator of the Post Herbarium/member of the Natural History Museum), and Leila Sidaoui (AUB friend).

• Initiative for green roof research group: the department (S. Talhouk) is leading an initiative to launch a research group that focuses on urban and sustainable greening and turn AUB as a showcase in this field. In addition to S. Talhouk, the committee in charge consists of the following four other LDEM members: Y. Abunnasr, N. Al-Akl, M. Fabian, N. Farajalla

Department Outreach Activities

- School visits to the greenhouse area: Several campus tree tours were organized by M. Fabian (instructor/ greenhouse supervisor) for around 160 school students in addition to accompanying administration staff. Among the visiting schools were Collège Protestant Français and the International College (IC).
- Community service for Syrian refugees: Final Year LDEM students and their instructor organized, as part of their "Site engineering: Design implementation" (LDEM 249) course, a one-day donation campaign in front of AUB's West Hall on March 24, 2014 for a Syrian refugee camp in Saida. Donations in the form of books, school stationary and artistic supplies were collected. A facebook page was created for this event entitled "Ghouroub Al-Shams". A 5000USD donation was also received from BLC bank to implement this project.
- University for seniors: the department offered a course on campus landscape trees and shrubs during spring 2013-2014 which included historical overview and campus tours. The course was taught by S. Talhouk, G. Battikha and M. Fabian. A total of twenty-five participants attended all three course sessions.

Department Visibility

Department brochure: LDEM faculty members (N. Al-Akl and S. Talhouk)
completed the first department brochure as part of the department visibility
in November 2013. This brochure was distributed during the ASLA meeting
in Boston in November 2013 to professionals and firms from the landscape
architecture field.

Department visibility and student internship opportunities: In line with the department visibility strategy, N. Al-Akl received FAFS support (shortterm faculty development grant) to attend the ASLA (American Society of Landscape Architects) annual meeting and expo which was held in Boston, USA from November 14 to 18, 2013. The objectives of the visit were to: Meet international employers and landscape firms that are currently conducting work in the Middle East and the Gulf to secure internship opportunities at their firms for LDEM students; interact with peer professionals and academicians to plan for collaborative teaching within the context of student exchange and study abroad; visit the Sasaki Associates office to continue discussion on the yearly internship opportunity for LDEM students at their firm; present the LDEM department to conference participants by distributing the department brochure. In addition, N. Al-Akl attended the educational sessions covering the latest topics in the field, and upon her return, she shared her findings by giving a presentation at a department meeting. This expo, which is one of the most important and most recognized landscape conferences internationally, was held at the Boston Convention and Exhibition Center, Boston, USA.

- Tamayouz Award: Professor Associate J. Mahzoumi was awarded the Tamayouz Award 2013 for outstanding women architects in Iraq in October 2013. It is an excellence award for women who have contributed to the fields of architecture and construction throughout Iraq.

Student Activities

The participants occupied a small parking area in front of Café Hamra and decorated the space with turf, potted trees, shrubs, and benches, inviting fellow students and passers-by to sit and enjoy the greenery. The event served to underline Beirut's lack of green spaces and the physical and psychological benefits of transforming parking spaces into small public parks.
- Christmas Party: The Landscape Student Society and FAFS SRC organized a Christmas event on December 11, 2013.
- Meeting with SRC and Landscape Society representatives: Following issues raised with the Dean during a student town meeting, the Chair met

with representatives from the Landscape Society and FAFS-SRC during November 2013 to channel students' complaints and suggestions.

C. Department of Nutrition and Food Sciences

Highlights

During the period of September 1, 2013 to August 31, 2014, the Nutrition and Food Sciences department witnessed several changes that contributed to its growth and development.

- In November 2013, the undergraduate Nutrition and Dietetics Coordinated Program (NDCP) received US accreditation from the Accreditation Council for Education in Nutrition and Dietetics (ACEND). This accreditation provides a stamp of approval confirming the quality of the department's nutrition education. The NDCP is the first and only nutrition program in the entire Middle East to obtain a US accreditation and the third in the world to receive accreditation outside the US. This prestigious international recognition of the NDCP is a significant compliment to the didactic Nutrition and Dietetics track at NFSC which has also successfully completed an external review last year.
- The NFSC department proposed curricular changes for the NDCP to meet ACEND requirements as well as curricular changes for the Nutrition and Dietetics (ND) to ensure continuing improvement within the program. These curricular changes were approved by the Board of Trustees in May 30, 2014.
- The NFSC department organized a panel discussion entitled "Nutritionists in the Media: the effects of media on nutrition beliefs and choices" as part of a series of events celebrating the accreditation by ACEND.

- A group of researchers at the Nutrition and Food Sciences department, FAFS (Dr. Farah Naja, Dean Hwalla, and Dr. Nasreddine) received a million dollar grant from Qatar Foundation to launch the first Mother and Infant Nutritional Assessment (MINA) cohort study in the Middle East.
- Professor Emeritus Dr. Raja Tannous passed away. Dr. Tannous joined FAFS in 1963 as Assistant Professor of Food Technology and Nutrition and retired as Professor in 2009. Dr. Tannous has served intermittently as Chairperson of the Nutrition and Food Sciences Department (NFSC) for 15 years and as Acting Dean of FAFS for 5 years. Dr. Tannous was appointed as Emeritus Professor in November 16, 2012. He was consultant on food technology to the industry as well as to several international agencies such as FAO, UNICEF and UNIDO where he served as Chairman of the Food Safety Panel that prepared a first draft of a Food Safety Law and Authority for Lebanon. Dr. Tannous served also as the President of the Lebanese Association of Food Scientists and Technologists.
- Dr. Kassaify got approval for a leave without pay effective fall 2014-2015, whereby she will assume the position of Microbiology Manager in Mars company (Dubai).
- Dr. Nasreddine was appointed as Chairperson for the period of three years effective June 2014.
- Dr. Lamis Jomaa joined the department as Assistant Professor in Community Nutrition, effective spring 2014.
- Professor Ewen Todd from the University of Glasgow will join the department as visiting professor in microbiology, effective fall 2014-2015.
- Dr. Kassaify and NFSC faculty members reviewed the summary and follow up recommendations on the program review prepared by Dr. Ali Hajj. These recommendations have been discussed in a conclusive meeting on September 12, 2013 in the presence of Provost Dallal and Dean Hwalla.
- NFSC ad-hoc committee chaired by Dr. Kassaify and including Drs. Abiad,
 Olabi and Nabhani and Ms. Hamzeh, proposed revisions for the FSMT
 curriculum for the purpose of certification by IUFoST and accreditation
 by IFT, and finalized, in collaboration with FEA, the proposal to create a
 Food Engineering undergraduate degree that allows graduates to enter the
 Syndicate of Engineers.
- The department invited Dr. Isabelle Romieu as a URB scholar during April 2014. Dr. Romieu is the head of the Nutritional Epidemiology Group at the International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC) in the World Health Organization. Dr. Romieu delivered three seminars tackling the role of Nutrition in the prevention of cancer.

- Students from the department ranked second in the 8th annual IBDAA competition (Student Innovation Initiative) that took place in April 2014.
- NDCP students organized a Fit-a-thon on October 11 and 12, 2013 and a food tasting event on October 3, 2013.
- NFSC faculty members published more than twenty papers in international peer-reviewed journals.
- Seven faculty members received research grants from the University Research Board.
- Faculty members attracted more than eight extra-mural grants (ESCWA, UNICEF, Société des Eaux Minerales Libanaises, WHO, European Union, Coca-Cola and Qatar Foundation). Extramural funding amounted to \$1,461,000.
- More than twenty abstracts and presentations were accepted in regional and international conferences: International Association for Food Protection Annual Meeting (USA), Regional Conference of ESCWA (Morocco), Dubai International Food Safety Conference, Fourth Annual AUB Biomedical Research Day, International Conference on Nutrition and Growth (Spain) and the International Congress of Nutrition (Spain).

The NFSC department has thirteen full-time faculty members including three instructors, five part-time faculty members, and eight research assistants out of whom five are appointed on research grants. Thirteen graduate assistants were appointed for the first semester (fall 2013-2014), fourteen for the second semester (spring 2013-2014) and four for the summer session (2013-2014).
