What is Food Security?

"Food security exists when all people, at all times, have **physical**, **social**, and **economic** access to **sufficient**, **safe** and **nutritious** food that meets their **dietary needs** and food preferences for an **active and healthy life**."

- World Food Summit, 2009



Key Dimensions of Food Security

AVAILABILITY

Physical AVAILABILITY of food

ACCESS

Economic, physical & social ACCESS to food

UTILIZATION

Food UTILIZATION

STABILITY

STABLITY of the other dimensions over time

The Arab region is considered one of the most food insecure in the world according to WFS definition.




Food Security Challenges for MENA

- Land: limited supply of agricultural lands
- Water: limited water supply
- Demography: demand pressures of an urbanized, young population
- Malnutrition: high rates of stunting, indicating a chronic problem in vulnerable and food insecure population groups
- Poverty: limited access to food due to inadequate income and lack of entitlements
- Instability: low food stability and vulnerability to shocks
- Information: poor availability of and access to information systems
- Mapping: poor monitoring of food security
- Policy: weak policy response, with little or no regional coordination


National-level Food Security in MENA

Food Insecurity in Vulnerable Communities in Lebanon

Syrian refugees: 93%

Palestine Refugees from Syria: 95%

Palestine Refugees: 62%

Lebanese host communities: 42-52%
