Mental illness is on the rise in the Arab region and is one of the most pervasive disorders affecting individuals across the lifespan. Wars, instabilities, economic crises contribute heavily to the phenomenon. Societies have little human resources to meet the needs despite recent increase in the number of mental health professionals. It becomes important for all healthcare providers to develop their psychological and psychiatric knowledge and skills. Hence, the need for a contextualized, culturally sensitive, rigorous and high-quality training, and continuous education.

The Department of Psychiatry–Faculty of Medicine at the American University of Beirut has more than 30 clinicians (with diverse and rich backgrounds psychiatrists, psychologists, special educators, rehabilitation professionals). It is well–positioned to offer mental health training for the specialist and non–specialist.

About the Mental Health Academy (MHA)

The Mental Health Academy offers high standard and advanced interactive mental health training modules to mental health professionals and other healthcare disciplines in collaboration with local and international experts in the field.

At the end of each training and depending on its length and content level, the Academy delivers either a certificate of attendance or a diploma.
