

2- SITE VISIT FOR THE NEW YORK STATE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT (NYSED)

May 31-June 1	Dr, Olivier Nicolay (New York University) and Dr. Eser Tufekci (Virginia Commonwealth University) were the examiners on behalf of NYSED.
September	In their report, they upheld the statement made in 2013, and in 2016, that our program was "second to none" and qualified the program as "very impressive." They stated that their visit "confirmed that the MS in Orthodontics program outlined by the American University of Beirut provides the residents it admits with a comprehensive, thorough, and challenging education. This challenging clinical and didactic education is second to none."



We have submitted our response to the report and additional inquiry about facility resources by NYSED. Should the Report and Response be approved by NYSED, we shall enter the regular American cycle of reviews every 7 years.
