- English 300 Requirement (as in admission notification)
- Responsible Conduct of Research: (RCR) Requirement
- Maximum Residency (be familiar with rules)
- Continuous Thesis Registration
- Leave of Absence (apply before!)
- Extended Absence



Responsible Use of Al in Academic Studies

Al tools can support research in:

➢ Generating ideas – Brainstorming– Language editing – Summarizing articles – Generating citations or code

Al Has Limits; Know the Limitations:

- Al can produce **inaccurate**, **biased**, or **fabricated** content
- It lacks human judgment, critical thinking, and context awareness.
- Cannot replace original research, analysis, or authorship

Librarians can guide you on:

- When and how to cite Al
- Responsible research practices
- **Databases** integrating AI features
- Workshops/Sessions/Guides

✓ Use Ethically & Transparently:

- ✓ Always review, evaluate, and verify Al-generated outputs.
- ✓ If AI substantially contributes, acknowledge or cite it:

Example: "Assisted by ChatGPT, OpenAI (2025)"

Avoid using AI to:

- Complete graded assignments
- Generate text without attribution
- Generate or falsify data

(#) Keep in Mind:

Be Transparent – Be Accountable

Your academic work should always reflect **your own thinking and integrity**.
