PREFACE

The year 2019-20 marked several major changes and unique challenges at the Hariri School of Nursing (HSON). HSON Faculty and staff honored Dr. Huda Abu-Saad Huijer, HSON former founding Dean, at the graduation gala dinner, in May 2019. On September 1, 2019, Dr. Laila Farhood was appointed as HSON Interim Dean, one month before the October 2019 uprising/revolution. AUB and HSON in particular faced several challenges due to the difficult economic and political situation in the country. End of October 2019, roads were blocked due to a nationwide uprising; however, HSON faculty continued their commitment to teach theory and clinical courses. On the other hand, nursing students volunteered their time at AUBMC, caring for patients in order to fill the shortage of nurse's gap who could not come to work.

As for AUB and HSON governance, I/Dean Farhood appointed Dr. Samar Noureddine as Associate Dean and Convener of the Graduate Division and Dr. Nuhad Dumit as Convener of the Undergraduate Division. In addition, Faculty members from the Undergraduate (UG) and Graduate Divisions were appointed to represent HSON on several AUB committees.

In Fall 2019, although the number of newly enrolled students at the UG level was relatively high compared to previous years (78 in Fall 2019 compared to 60 in Fall 2018), many students even with the 60% (Financial Aid and HSON scholarship) left the program, because they could not afford to pay their tuition fees in the absence of bank loans. They were drastically affected by the deteriorating economic situation in the country. Sixteen new students were enrolled in the MSN program compared to 17 in Fall 2018 and in September 2019, three additional students joined the PhD program that was launched in Fall 2018.

Spring 2020, we celebrated the international year of the Nurse. Then Covid-19 impacting the world thus shaping the experiences of our faculty and students. We have lived through this traumatic experience which was beyond imagination. Faculty and students brought ahead new teaching strategies thus rethinking our life as a school and community. We have brought ahead new ways of teaching and learning and were supported by AUB president Khuri and higher administration, an experience we should not forget. These are important times that shaped our lives with a different sense of meaning and setting strategies reshaping nursing education based on research and addressing future societal challenges. It's worth noting that our school (HSON) was the first among AUB faculties to observe in- person graduation to our students, a time of relief and getting ready to begin their nursing careers and step into their new and challenging roles.

All of the above could not be accomplished without our stellar faculty and staff. We are proud that we have the largest number of faculty with PhD degrees in Lebanon. HSON also has the highest number of funded research projects and the highest publication rate in Lebanon. HSON faculty have published in top-tier refereed journals and are among the most productive and impactful nurse researchers in the Arab world. A number of HSON faculty have either a joint clinical appointments or clinical associate positions with the Faculty of Medicine/AUB Medical Center. They have excelled clinically by establishing collaborative clinics in their specialty areas, thus setting the stage for many more of such future collaborations.

Despite the challenges, we are still planning to launch many hybrid programs at the graduate level in 2020, such as the Blended Master in Nursing Administration and Management, and to pioneer new modalities in program development.

Despite the economic crisis, HSON continues to place emphasis on research and scholarly productivity, teaching excellence, develop new strategies for student recruitment and find additional funds for student scholarships thus expanding the existing HSON academic programs based on new and innovative strategic initiatives. We continue to be proud of our achievements, which are detailed in this annual report.

II. FACULTY ACTIVITIES

A. EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

BSN:

A total of 197 and 196 undergraduate students were enrolled in 2019 in 2020, respectively. Course descriptions, credit hours, and learning objectives did not change this year as student evaluations were positive. We were, however, required to provide two sections of junior-year courses because of the large class size in 2019. Classes were carried online in 2020 due to COVID 19 lockdowns; however, practicum was carried in the clinical areas. In spring 2020, the practicum of three courses [community health, mental health, and leadership and management in nursing] were integrated to ensure students complete requirements despite the limited clinical sites. For example students in community health selected their in-patients' families in the leadership course to do telehealth awareness about COVID-19 to meet the community clinical requirements. The same for the mental health course, patients were selected during the leadership rotation to do Interpersonal Relation assignment for the mental health course. It is worth mentioning that the clinical hours required for each course was met.

Simulation activities were included in most clinical nursing courses, including practice through skill training and scenarios. The Objective Structured Clinical Examination (OSCE) was used in all clinical nursing courses.

MSN:

A total of 56 students enrolled in the MSN program in October 2019 and 49 in October 2020 Four tracks continue to be offered: Adult Gerontology Clinical Nurse Specialist, Nursing Administration and Management, Psychiatry and Mental Health Clinical Nurse Specialist, and Community and Public Health Nursing. Information on the specific tracks is detailed below:

Adult Gerontology Clinical Nurse Specialist track:

- Two students graduated in 2019 and one in 2020
- A total of 17 students were enrolled in October 2019 and 25 in October 2020
- Students in the Adult Gerontology Clinical Nurse Specialist track completed residencies at AUBMC, Johns Hopkins University and the University of Maryland.

Nursing Administration and Management track:

- Two students graduated in 2019 and three in 2020
- A total of 17 students were enrolled in October 2019 and 12 in October 2020
- Students in the Nursing Administration and Management track completed residencies at the Evidence Based Health Management Unit (EHMU), AUBMC, University of Maryland and the Ministry of Public Health.

Psychiatry and Mental Health Clinical Nurse Specialist track:

- Four students graduated in 2019 and one in 2020
- Ten students were enrolled in October 2019 and four in October 2020
- Students in the Psychiatry and Mental Health Clinical Nurse Specialist track completed residencies at AUBMC.

Community and Public Health Nursing track:

- Four students graduated in 2019 and one in 2020.
- A total of 14 students were enrolled in October 2019 and 15 in October 2020.
- One student completed the residency at the University of Colorado Hospital- Anschutz Medical Campus, Outpatient Pavilion-Health Nexus.

PhD Program:

- Six students were enrolled in October 2019 and nine students in 2020
- Nine new applications were received in the Fall of 2019, six were accepted and three were newly enrolled in the Fall of 2020.


B. SIMULATION TECHNOLOGY at HSON

Academic Year 2019-2020


During 2019-2020, the Simulation and Clinical Competency Center (SCCC) provided activities/services – for both AUB and non-AUB users - in line with its mission statement. Users included HSON students enrolled in undergraduate and graduate programs (HSON users), nutrition and dietetics students, medical students, residents, faculty members and nurses from AUB and elsewhere (non-HSON users).

The figures below summarize activities done at the SCCC by semester

In 2020, SCCC supported 178 simulation training activities/ experiences that involved 2339 participants, including HSON and Non-HSON users. When comparing 2020 statistics with that for year 2019, we notice a 60% decrease in activities and 80% decrease in the number of participants. This is expected due to lock down because of COVID 19. For both years, the spring semester had the highest number of activities (53%) and the around the same number of users (Figure 1 & Figure 2 respectively).




Legend: Educational Activity: each time the lab is utilized regardless of the objectives or content of the learning/teaching that is occurring.




Legend: Participant: a person using the lab whether student, resident, nurse, or employee from AUB/AUBMC community or outside.

During the spring and fall semesters for both years (2020 & 2019), HSON activities outnumbered Non-HSON activities. Only during the summer of 2019 the Lab had more Non-HSON activities- medicine finish their spring semester much later than nursing (see figure 3).



In 2019 and through all semesters, non-HSON users outnumbered HSON users (medicine classes come in big numbers). The exception is year 2020, where we had more HSON users again because of COVID 19 - we restricted access to lab for non-nursing (See figure 4).

- A total of **80** interviews were conducted in May and June 2019 with new and currently registered BSN students for HSON Scholarships. **Forty one** were recommended, and **33** were awarded the scholarship and enrolled. The 60% (Financial Aid and HSON scholarship) is still attracting students who select a nursing major as their 3rd, 4th, or 5th choice when they apply to AUB.
- In 2020, due to the limited scholarship funds available, HSON relied mainly on the Hariri Endowed Fund. In the Fall 2020-21, HSON has coordinated with the Office of Financial Aid to offer additional financial support to new students. As a result, all new students received additional Financial Aid up to 60% in total. Twenty one students received additional financial support (19 new and 2 continuing).

B. STUDENT RECRUITMENT AND MARKETING

Student recruitment and marketing of the BSN and MSN programs remain a priority at HSON. The marketing strategy for student recruitment in 2019 and 2020 included various activities:

 Graduate Open House: HSON participated in the Graduate Open House on February 20, 2019 organized by the Graduate Council. The event was very successful; 132 candidates expressed their interest in the MSN programs and 36 were interested in the PhD in nursing science. A list of potential applicants is documented for recruitment and follow up on admission applications.

- **School visits:** Due to the October 17 national uprising/revolution and road blocks, schools were not flexible in providing a one-hour for student orientation about HSON as they were closed several days due to the situation. As an alternative, the power point presentation has been sent to some student counselors to disseminate to their student body.
- **AUBMC Open House:** On April 23, 2019, HSON participated in the AUBMC Open House to recruit nurses from all over Lebanon. The SSO had a booth to promote the MSN and PhD programs.
- Marketing and promotion of HSON academic programs is also done through:
 - Social media: In addition to Facebook, LinkedIn and YouTube, a twitter account has been created for HSON.
 - Nursing Centralized Application System (CAS) portal: to recruit students from North America for the MSN program and for the BA/BS-BSN second degree accelerated program.
- In 2020, recruitment efforts were affected by October 17 revolution and COVID-19 pandemic.
 HSON has not done any school visit in year 2020. However, HSON organized in January and
 February 2020 a recruitment program with different scout groups in Lebanon where they
 attended informational sessions about nursing, first aid sessions, scenarios at the simulation lab
 and relevant games. In addition, HSON participated in weekly virtual orientation sessions, in
 coordination with the Office of Admissions to promote the UG program.
- At the graduate level, HSON participated in the Graduate Open House that was organized in February 19, 2020 to promote the MSN and the PhD program.
- An Undergraduate Virtual Open House in April 2020 replaced the AUB school fair and due to COVID-19 pandemic, the orientation was online and attracted more than 400 participants. HSON Dean, faculty, staff and students participated in the open house. A follow up was done with interested applicants a week later, where they were given the opportunity to attend online classes and shadow our nursing students during their clinical practice. Interested applicants provided positive feedback on the orientation experience and ended up by applying and enrolling in the BSN program.

C. STUDENT ACTIVITIES

Nursing students were involved in various community projects and activities in their Community Course and in events organized by the Nursing Students Society (NSS) in 2019:

- **New Student Orientation:** During the orientation of newly-enrolled students, some undergraduate and graduate students provided testimonials and success stories about the nursing profession.
- AUB Mentorship in Nursing: The AUB Mentors in Nursing (AMIN) program continues to provide a lot of support to new students, by guiding them into the registration process, informing them about the student life, etc.

- **School Fair:** BSN and MSN students participated in the AUB School Fair that was held on Campus, from April 1- April 17, 2019. On April 21, 2020, students presented their testimonials in the Virtual Open House that replaced the school fair. The school fair and the virtual Open House was organized by the office of admissions and was open to students from different high schools.
- The AACN Graduate Nursing Student Academy (GNSA): Ninar Skheita was selected to be the new GNSA liaison for HSON graduate students for the AY-2019-20. She informs graduate students about upcoming events, news, conferences, career fairs, etc.
- University Research Volunteer Program (URVP): Occasionally, undergraduate nursing students volunteer to participate in the University Research Volunteer Program (URVP) organized by AUB.
- AUB Outdoors: Nursing students participated in the AUB Outdoors activities in May 2019.
- **NSS elections:** Elections for the Nursing Student Society were held in May 2019 and a cabinet was formed.
- **SRC and USFC elections:** Elections for the SRC and USFC were cancelled in 2019 due to the national uprising/revolution and were conducted online in 2020; it is worth mentioning that it was the first nursing students had seats in the USFC as an independent school.
- AMIN coffee hour: In the fall 2019-20, AMIN mentors organized a coffee hour for new and returning students so new students can learn from senior students about the program, activities, etc.
- **Trivia Night:** On March 6, 2019, the first Trivia Night was held by the Nursing Students Society (NSS). Students tested their general knowledge and fun spirits and got competitive. In the end, the winning three teams got valuable prizes from sponsors: Latte Art, Spiced and Sliced, The Conut, Roadster Dinner, and Crepaway!
- LGBT Health Workshop: On March 17, 2019, the NSS and LEBMASH held the LGBT Health Student Workshop. This workshop provided students with basic knowledge about sexual health, health concerns, and disparities of lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender communities. The workshop used active learning strategies to provide students with opportunities to practice affirming and inclusive health regardless of sexual orientation or gender identity.

Other activities:

- In 2020, the Nursing Student Society conducted Christmas Cookies event-fundraising, Toys and books drive drop off, and Psychiatric awareness campaign on mental health.
- Following the August 4, 2020 blast, nursing students were involved in several community projects in Beirut, Karantina for screening, blood/sugar tests, promoting COVID-19 precaution

measures and assessing health care needs. These activities were featured in the international AACN newsletter.

D. OTHER STUDENT SERVICES AND RESOURCES

Credentialing Requests of Nursing Graduates

At the request of the Student Services Office, a new online credentialing request has been developed by the IT Department that enables nursing alumni to request and pay for their credentials online. The service went live in early 2019.

With the great demand for certification in different areas of nursing, the number of requests for credentials has increased from 20 in 2019 to 28 in 2020. The majority of requests were submitted to the Commission on Graduates of Foreign Nursing Schools (CGFNS) in the USA.

Electronic Archiving System

HSON is trying to implement an electronic archiving system for student files in coordination with the IT team and other departments at AUB. HSON attended several training sessions on LaserFiche archiving system, awaiting the final approval to get the License.

Online Student Orientation and Advising

The New student Orientation and group advising were held online in the Fall 2020-21. The orientation is now created as a course on Moodle with different live sessions, videos, visuals and other instructions to guide the new students. In addition, the AMIN mentors played a major role to help the students to have a smooth integration in the program. To minimize the registration problems and answer all new student inquiries, the Student Services Officer held several live sessions to address all student registration issues, minimize the registration problems and answer all new students inquiries.

New Academic Programs: HSON plans to expand its current undergraduate and graduate academic programs and continue to contribute to the development of healthcare in Lebanon and the region.

- At the undergraduate level, HSON plans to evaluate and revisit the second degree program to attract more BA/BS graduates.
- The proposal to launch a TS-BSN program at AUB AREC in the Beqaa area is being finalized and will be launched as soon as university approval is secured.
- At the graduate level, HSON will be launching an online/hybrid MSN track in Nursing Administration and Management. The Nursing Education hybrid track is still under discussion.

Other Developments:

- New strategies in Student recruitment will be developed. HSON continues to award merit scholarships and coordinate with the Financial Aid and the Office of Development to provide additional support in the absence of student loans.
- More emphasis will continue to be placed on graduate recruitment at the national, regional, and international levels in close collaboration with the AUB Graduate Council.
- Increasing the number of scholarships remains a major priority for HSON and is critical to the success of current and new programs. The establishment of more endowed funds remains a strategic goal for HSON.
