

#### Message from the Director- Dr. Huda Huijer

In 2017, the Board of Graduate Studies, the AUB senate, the Board of Trustees, and the New York State Education Department (NYSED) approved the HSON PhD in Nursing Science proposal. The PhD program will be formally launched September 2018 in close collaboration with Johns Hopkins University and University of Michigan Schools of Nursing and with the Faculty of Medicine and Faculty of Health Sciences at AUB.

We are proud to report that HSON currently has the highest number of PhD-holder nursing faculty and the highest number of scientific publications in Lebanon. On research productivity, HSON accounts for 85 % of Lebanon's and nearly 10 % of the Arab world's nursing research output; its faculty are amongst the most productive and impactful nurse researchers in the Arab world.

In 2017, HSON ranked 147 out of 503 schools of nursing offering graduate programs based on U.S. News & World Report Ranking. HSON remains the only graduate nursing school in the region which is ranked by US News and World Report.

The school continues to place emphasis on research and scholarly productivity, teaching excellence, faculty and student recruitment, and on expanding HSON academic programs based on new and innovative strategic initiatives.

# Nursing Matters: Message from Dr. Nuhad Dumit President of the Order of Nurses in Lebanon

The Order of Nurses in Lebanon is currently presided by one of our faculty, Dr. Nuhad Dumit. In her capacity as the President of the Order, Dr. Dumit shared the main strategic goals put by the Order that will move forward the nursing profession in Lebanon. Herein a brief of what is planned.

The first goal is to protect nurses and support their rights. This strategic goal aims at improving the working conditions of nurses. The main action plan is to improve the salary scale of nurses. If we need to recruit and retain nurses, we need to make their salaries more lucrative. Further, the cost opportunity for raising salaries will be better quality of care. In a recent research conducted in 2006, a study has shown that improving the salary of nurses was associated with better clinical nursing sensitive outcomes and eventually better patient outcomes. The second aim of the first strategic goal is to ensure that all nurses in Lebanon have access to health and social insurance through their membership with the Order of Nurses in Lebanon. All active nurses in Lebanon are highly encouraged to become members of the Order in order to benefit from the pension plan following retirement.

The second strategic goal is to advance the profession in education and practice. Initiatives related to this goal are: proposing a regulatory law about the standards and scope of practice and related competencies of nurses in different healthcare settings; and updating their job descriptions accordingly; and legislating continuing nursing education for safe practice. It is important to ensure that every institution has a clear understanding of the role, responsibilities and competencies that a nurse can fulfill in order to make the best of their capacities. Further, it is important to ensure that these roles are eventually being implemented. Another initiative is launching capacity building programs for nurses at various levels, in administration and management, bedside, community and schools.

The third strategic goal is to improve the image of nursing in Lebanon and internationally. There are various misconceptions that surround the nursing profession. These misconceptions often stem from our misunderstanding of the profession and present themselves as a major factor for the suboptimal enrollment in nursing education. The Order of Nurses is currently trying to redress these misconceptions by launching a campaign to promote the role of nurses in all settings. Additionally the Order made achievements that are internationally recognized by the International Council of Nurses (ICN) and the European Federation of Educators in Nursing Science. As such, the Order is hosting for the first time in Lebanon and the region the ICN Nursing Workforce Forum in May and September 2018 in addition to having an international nursing conference endorsed by ICN.

The fourth goal is to improve the code of conduct among nurses. There is a need to pilot test and educate about the code of ethics of nurses created by the Order and ensure that all nurses abide by them before having it legislated by the parliament.


#### Ph.D. Program

The PhD program in Nursing Science aims to provide rigorous training for research careers in nursing and healthcare. It develops capacity for scholarly and independent inquiry, critical thinking, and the ability to communicate research findings, and transfer evidence-based knowledge into healthcare practice. Graduates of the program will be prepared to assume positions in academia as faculty, research scientists, educators, and as leaders in health systems.

The PhD program will focus on two elements critical to advancing health:

- 1) Physical and mental health, especially among the chronically ill and the aging populations
- 2) care delivery and system-level analysis and improvement. **Regular PhD Program Requirements**

The PhD program requires a minimum of 48 credit hours of course work beyond the Master's degree including dissertation work. The course work consists of a minimum of 20 credits of core courses, 6 credits of electives, and 22 credits dissertation work.



To prepare students for careers in academic research, teaching, and healthcare administration.

#### Areas of Focus

- 1) Physical and mental health, especially among the chronically ill and aging populations
- 2) Health care delivery and system-level analysis

The PhD program will be in collaboration with Johns Hopkins University, the University of Michigan-and with the Faculty of Medicine and Faculty of Health Sciences at AUB.
