Responding to Crisis



Business Continuity Plan To safeguard AUB's research mission during the crisis, we partnered with the Offices of Human Resources, Procurement, and Finance to support researcher wellbeing, adapt projects to new realities, secure critical funding and supplies, and maintain strong communication with our partners.

Research for Defiance, Hope, and Impact Initiative This initiative aimed to foster impactful, interdisciplinary research and strengthen collaboration across AUB's faculty, particularly in response to the crisis. Building on the university's expertise and ongoing projects, six facultyled working groups were formed, focusing on environment, urban studies, forced displacement, research in times

of war, capacity building, and healthcare workers. Stimulus Funding for Research on the War in Lebanon On November 1, 2024, the Office of Research launched a stimulus funding opportunity to support high-quality, interdisciplinary, and impactful projects. Selected proposals received up to \$20,000 and officially commenced on

March 1, 2025. Inter-University Seed Grant (IUSG) for Research Related to Conflict The Office of Research launched the Inter-University Seed Grant (IUSG) for Research Related to Conflict, in partnership with the International Development Research Centre (IDRC). This initiative supported collaborations between AUB faculty and colleagues from conflict-affected universities in the Middle East and North Africa (MENA) region, focusing on themes such as forced displacement, environment, healthcare workers, ethical challenges of

research, and recovery from conflict. Funded projects were awarded up to \$36,000 and began in June 2025.






